# MESSAGE FROM THE OPERATIONS DIRECTOR

Ver 160 million people on the African continent speak French. Over the past century, Africa has become the centre of the French speaking world. This trend is set to explode exponentially with the French-speaking population in Africa expected to grow to more than 300 million people by the year 2050, according to the United Nations.

Despite the evident requirement to serve and meet the needs of this growing population, the African BBT neither has the permission or license to freely print French books.

The Bhaktivedanta Book Trust was founded in 1972 by His Divine Grace A. C. Bhaktivedanta Swami Prabhupada for the sole purpose of publishing, printing, and propagating the teachings of the Gaudiya Vaisnava tradition to the world. In the very philosophy of our spiritual tradition, Lord Caitanya, the yuga avatara (manifestation of the Lord for our current age), has stated:

prthivite ache yata nagaradi grama (Caitanya Bhagavata, Antya-khanda 4.126) "In every town and village of the world, the chanting of My name will be heard." But why not these towns of West Africa? Srila Prabhupada explains to us, "Giving people knowledge [of God], *jnana*, is the highest service to humanity."

With the spiritual and moral conviction of these instructions, we are obliged to act to fulfill them. In 2021 this was BBT Africa's highest priority. The African BBT has diligently and intensely endeavored to lift the structural bottlenecks that our institution operates under so we can serve not just some people on our vast and beautiful continent, but serve all people. We must tackle the decade-long French book challenge in Africa with boldness and compassion for the people of Africa and claim the power of our agency to act for what is right.

BBT Africa suffered a slow-down in the production of new titles in 2021. However, we are excited to have upcoming titles such as *Sri Isopanisad* in Ahmaric and *Bhagavad-gita As It Is* in Mauritian Creole and isiZulu. The annual BBT Africa Conference and Bhaktivedanta Swami Lecture series continue to be spaces of diverse and critical thought and inspiration for book distribution in Africa. We hope to extend the reach of these events into the future.

Thank you to our BBT Africa team, African Ambassadors, Donors and Trustees for your support. It is because of your sacrifice, dedication, energy and the genuine desire to serve others in Africa that we continue to excel and humbly serve Srila Prabhupada's movement.

Central to our service are people. These books change lives. These books have

changed our lives. Let us all cherish that gift by giving others that gift.

I wish to extend my gratitude to our senior Trustee His Grace Govardhana Prabhu for his continued wisdom and support. I would also like to extend my personal gratitude to our Trustee Emeritus His Holiness Jayadvaita Swami.



## PRODUCTION REPORT

n a letter to Brahmananda Dasa (Calcutta, 12 December 1967), Srila Prabhupada expressed his pleasure at hearing about or receiving his newly published books:

"When one book is published, I think I have conquered an empire. So, try to publish as many books as possible and that will enhance the beauty and prestige of our society. . . . We should not only publish in English but also in other important languages such as French and German."

Of course, apart from French and German, Prabhupada wanted his books to be available in all the languages of the world and emphasised the need for translations. The global BBT has a mission statement to that effect:

"Krishna for everyone, in every language of the world." Hence, year after year, BBT Africa tirelessly endeavours to publishing all Prabhupada's books in all African languages to contribute to that great mission and vision.

Among those titles in production we're especially concentrating on:


- 1 Bhagavad-gita As It Is in isiZulu;

In 2021, BBT Africa reprinted the Chichewa *Beyond Birth and Death*.

As of 2021, we have 27 titles in production:

- · 12 in editing phase (1 Afrikaans, 1 English, 1 Xhosa, 8 Sotho; 1 isiZulu)
- 3 in translation phase (2 Afrikaans, 1 Lingala)
- 1 in typing phase (Igbo)



## **FINANCIAL SUMMARY**

n line with global economic trends, BBT Africa's financial performance showed marginal improvement in comparison to the 2020 financial year as a result of gradual opening up of economic activity.

Growth of book sales remained relatively unchanged in comparison to the 2020 financial year. Subscription income, which accounts for  $\sim$ 2% of total income, decreased by 20% year on year. The key expenses remain in line with growth objectives.

Over the years, BBT Africa has improved its financial position by purchasing fixed assets and investing in human capital to align with the organisation's strategic growth initiatives and has sufficient reserves to cover both short- and long-term costs for translation and book production.





# **BOOK DISTRIBUTION IN AFRICA**

The African Sankirtan team distributed a total of 118 393 BBT publications (books and magazines) in 2021. This accounted for 1,2% of the global total and is a decrease from Africa's contribution of 2,1% in 2020. In terms of both the number of books distributed as well as book points, Africa is placed 6<sup>th</sup> among the six participating continents.

While Africa's book distribution figures are still reflective of the impact of the global pandemic, several innovative ways to distribute books online have been embraced. This includes the distribution of books on online platforms such as Takelalot, website stores as well as telethons.

## **BHADRA CAMPAIGN**



The Bhadra Campaign was launched in 2017, and is inspired by the *Srimad-Bhagavatam* verse 12.13.13, which states, "If on the full moon day of the month of Bhadra one places *Srimad-Bhagavatam* on a golden throne and gives it as a gift, he will attain the supreme transcendental destination."

The global goal for the 2021 campaign was to distribute at least 25 000 full sets of *Srimad-Bhagavatam*. This goal was surpassed and a total of over 35 000 sets were distributed globally.

The African sankirtan team distributed a total of 241 Srimad-Bhagavatam sets over the period of this year's Bhadra Campaign which ran from 28 March to 20 September.

This is 107 sets more than was distributed by the team over last year's campaign in which the team distributed a total of 134 sets. On the day of Bhadra Purnima alone, a total of 135 sets were distributed in Africa, which in itself was higher than what was distributed over the entire Bhadra Campaign last year.

The mood and spirit in which the participating teams in Africa worked together on the day of Bhadra Purnima and throughout the campaign is most noteworthy.

It is also pleasing to note that three additional countries participated in this year's campaign. These are Malawi, Zambia and Zimbabwe.

# **LIVE TO GIVE CAMPAIGN**



The global goal for the 2021 Live to Give campaign, also known as the Prabhupada Marathon, was to distribute 2.2 million copies of *Bhagavad-gita* globally, from 21 September 2021 to 7 January 2022. For the pleasure of Srila Prabhupada, the

African Sankirtan Team collectively distributed a total of 14 578 *Bhagavadgitas* over the duration of the campaign.

The global team distributed a total of 2.8 million *Bhagavad-gitas*, thereby surpassing the goal 2.2 million.

## BHAKTIVEDANTA SWAMI LECTURE

The Bhaktivedanta Swami Lecture (BSL) is hosted in honour of His Divine Grace A. C. Bhaktivedanta Swami Prabhupada (1896-1977) the founder of The BBT, whose important literary contribution has been appreciated by global audiences for its Vedic commentary, on issues like education and leadership.


In 2021, BBT Africa hosted the 8<sup>th</sup> Annual BSL. The event was held online on 4 September 2021 and focused on Spirituality and Sustainability.

The lecture explored how these two topics, (Spirituality and Sustainability) when combined and realized, offer a valuable and enriching contribution in

terms of the universal agenda set out by the United Nations, Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Thus improving lifestyle, the economy, reclaiming care and compassion for the environment and fellow human beings with an end goal of universal harmony. The lecture further explored how the interconnectedness of indigenous knowledge coupled with modern systems can better harmonise our lifestyle.

The keynote address was delivered by Gauranga Dasa who is the Divisional Director of the Govardhan Ecovillage (GEV) in Mumbai India.

## **CONFERENCE**



The annual BBT Africa Conference is a platform which allows for the discussion of the production and distribution of Srila Prabhupada's books in Africa. BBT Africa hosts leading members of the International Society for Krishna Consciousness (ISKCON) with the intention to inspire book distributors and to adopt collaborative strategies.

The 12th annual BBT Africa Conference was held online and was themed: The African Narrative. The conference was aimed at celebrating and recognizing the African narrative in terms of efforts towards production, publishing and book distribution.

The challenges behind acquiring French books in Africa were unpacked and the efforts towards the inclusivity of indigenous communities was explored.

Leaders in book distribution from

discussed pertinent challenges and growth opportunities for book distribution in Africa.

Africa is known for its indigenous languages and activism on language preservation. The BBT supports this call through its mission on the preservation of African language by translating and publishing ancient Vedic texts and books in African Languages in Africa.

The discussions at the conference lead to the following resolutions:

- On the ground delivery of French books.
- To develop a book distribution master plan for the next five years.
- 3. To set up an innovation desk to support greater communication and shared ideas with fellow BBTs and other networks across the African continent.
